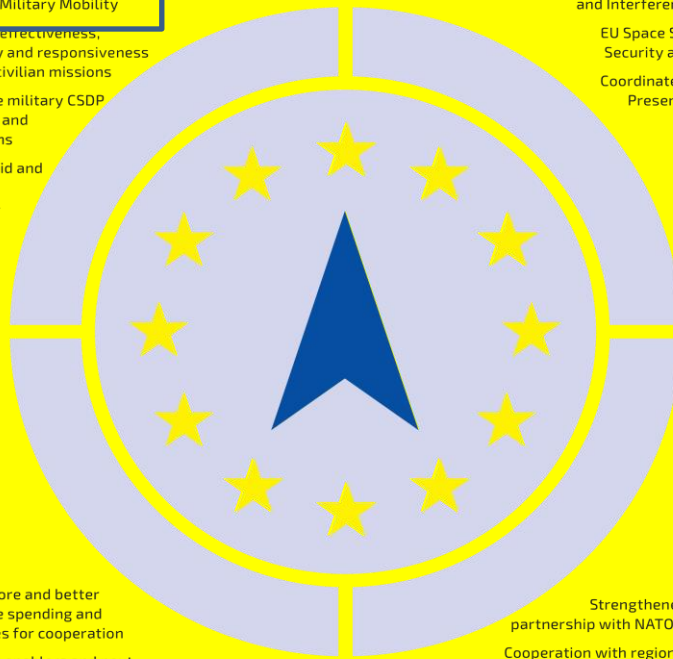

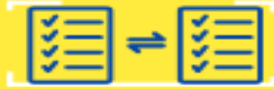


Military Mobility

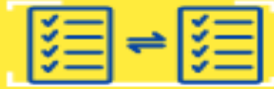


Action Plan on Military Mobility 2.0
