


Biography Dr. Caitlin FRAZER



Caitlin FRAZER is the Executive Director of the National Security Commission on Emerging Biotechnology (NSCEB), a bipartisan U.S. legislative commission established by Congress in the 2022 National Defense Authorization Act for the purpose of reviewing how emerging biotechnology affects U.S. Department of Defence (War) activities and matters of national security. In this capacity, she leads the staff of the Commission in supporting the Commissioners in advising Congress on policy issues at the

intersection of biotechnology, national security, and economic competitiveness. She previously served as Legislative Director to Senator Jon Ossoff (GA), a member of the Senate Intelligence Committee. She stood up the Office of Representative Chrissy Houlahan (PA-06) and served as her chief policy advisor as a member of the Armed Services and Foreign Affairs Committees. Earlier in her career, Caitlin was National Security Advisor to Senator Bob Casey (PA) and a policy advisor in the State Department's Bureau of South and Central Asian Affairs.
